a. Approval of new Committee member nomination

New member proposed: Melanie Forge. Finance Committee very supportive of her nomination. She has bookkeeping experience. **APPROVED**We are still looking for more members to serve on the Finance Committee (with Melanie current total is 5 members). The capacity of the committee is nine members.

Chris presented preliminary audit numbers last week: on target for balanced budget.

3) Operational Update – 15 minutes:

a. HVAC update

Chris has been meeting with Marc L. about the HVAC upgrade. They are raising concerns about whether or not we need to buy the top-of-the-line HVAC unit. They are contemplating researching a second option for cost comparison purposes. Finance committee will look into a second less-expensive option. This study should not affect the timeline of the HVAC project.

b. Bookkeeper staffing update

Advertisement was posted on Charity Village. Finance coordinator: received 22 applications (half of which met the minimum qualifications). Finance committee will narrow this pool of qualified candidates down to 4 or 5 candidates who will than be interviewed.

## c. Supper Table Manager staffing update

With Mary as an interim Manager, there was been a large reduction in the cost of food. We haven't compromised the quality of the meals and have seen an increased proportion of food donations to purchased food. There remain several challenges, such as ordering food from the Food Bank. The number of meals served per night is slightly down from last year (approx. 100 meals per night).

Four meetings were set-up to meet with volunteers. These went very well. Good opportunity to discuss the latest personnel change and address ongoing concerns (i.e. Supper Table paying rent, etc.). Good opportunity to field new ideas from volunteers. Looking into potentially meeting volunteers on a biannual basis. Sean (?) will be moving on from the Supper Table, due to the completion of his Masters' Thesis. Revisiting the personnel needs of the Supper Table to best support Mary & the Supper Table volunteers.

 Supper Table Advisory Committee 2014 action plan (cmb/Chris Adam)

Do we set a fixed amount or percentage amount that must be fundraised by the Supper Table on an annual basis? Increase the proportion of income coming from fundraising, compared to Grants & Private Donations. Suggestion: continue snowball fundraiser into the Spring with Eggs and into the Fall with Apples. Ensure communication from the Supper Table to parishioners about what food donations are required. Parish Budget 2014 expects an increase in Fundraising to \$13,000. Action Plan is deferred to April PPC Meeting.
