### Canadian Aid to Refugees Expected to Top \$1B

An article by Michael Swan in the Dec. 3 *Catholic Register* offers a good overview of Canadian aid, particularly through DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE, to the Syrian refugee situation in the Middle East. It also introduces readers to David Leduc, new CEO of DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE, who has aid experience in the Middle East.

Another \$100 million in federal government aid to Syrian refugees fleeing their nation's civil war brings Canada's spending on the refugee crisis so far to nearly \$1 billion. But a dollar-for-dollar matching fund open until Dec. 31 with approved charities is certain to push Canada's aid to the region well past that mark.

The Canadian Catholic Organization for Development and Peace is among the organizations eligible for matching funds. Its programs and partner organizations in the region deliver such basic netelling me "It's only cookies" and giving me a hug. I was reminded that they are just cookies, because the person who hugged me was facing a very challenging time. "They are just cookies..."

cessities as food and warm clothing but also are involved in education, trauma counselling and community organizing. Development and Peace has so far raised \$1.1 million to be matched by the government. Between January 2013 and Sept. 12 this year, when Ottawa announced its Syria Emergency Relief Fund, Development and Peace had raised another \$3 million outside the matching fund program.

Aid to the vast majority of Syria's 4.2 million refugees in Turkey, Iraq, Lebanon, Jordan and Egypt, as well as the country's 6.5 million internally displaced people, is the right thing to do, said Development and Peace executive director David Leduc.

"Absolutely it's important and I would say in some ways more important (than resettling refugees in Canada)," Leduc told The Catholic Register.

#### Ministry Highlight This Week: **Counters Ministry**

The Counting Team is made up of a group of wonderful, diligent and dedicated people. Two members of the team work together about one Sunday a month to count the monies the church has brought in during a given week. We start counting right after the 9:30 am Mass and generally finish around 1 pm. During this time, we count the donations from each Mass, as well as any money collected during the week from such sources as hall rentals, baptismal meetings and donations.

We collect the donations from the safe, count and double-count the donations, ensure the deposit balances, and fill in the deposit sheet. Money is then placed in a deposit bag and put in the safe. One of our members devised a spreadsheet we use to keep track of the dona-

tions from each Mass and which also allows us to check to see if we are balanced. Everyone has contributed in many ways to this mission, from bags for the coin cases, to purchasing needed items, to creating timetables, to bringing muffins from home to have with our coffee. Every once in a while, someone has an idea that contributes to the efficiency of what we do. Our members are a diversified group, from retired managers and teachers, to lawyers to foreign service workers, young and older, new and not so new.

We enjoy the each other's company, sharing our lives,

experiences and stories. Over coffee and whatever the fridge holds of interest, we happily spend three hours of each Sunday together.


